

Analysis of test results (12th Primary School of Drama - Greece)

The test has been passed to 100 students of the school, of which 47% are boys and 53% are girls.

The age of the students is:

10 years: 35%

11 years: 35%

12 years 30%

The nationality of the students is 98% Spanish and 2% foreigners, especially from Albania.

The 92% of the students are happy to come to the school. The main reasons are that they have their friends here and they have a good time at school. The 5% do not like to come to school because they want to stay at home or play with friends. The 3% sometimes are happy and sometimes not, depends on the day.

By one hand, being humiliated or made fun of by a colleague is the most frequent at our school, about 18% of students think that happens very often, follow by being threatened to be hurt or beaten by a colleague (5%).

It seems that using cell phones or the Internet by a colleague (or making others do it) to say or post hurtful things about them or getting hated on social media by colleagues because of looking or being different, never happens. (100% think so). This is why are very young yet and a lot of them don't have cell phones or Facebook accounts. In any case it's not allowed to use them at school

They say that very often have seen a colleague making fun or humiliating another, beaten, threatening or kicked out of a group. They never or very seldom have seen a colleague using cell phones or the Internet to say or post hurtful things about them or others or see a colleague putting bad labels of another on social media because of looking or being different.

Finally, the 10% and 6% admit that very often they humiliate or make fun of a colleague and beat a colleague.

About their answers to the question how do they react to the inappropriate attitude of some of their classmates, the 53% says that they will try to talk with the classmate and tell him/her to stop. 33% of student will ask for help to an adult, usually their parents, after school. 10% of students will do nothing and 4% will beat him/her.

When they see a colleague suffering due to the inappropriate attitude of some of their classmates, they will try to help him/her and go to look for a teacher. 27% will defend him/her, 13% will do nothing.

They say that everybody should obey the class and school rules. They believe that one of the measures that can be taken is to punish the aggressors, to expel them during a time of the school and to warn the parents. They think that teachers and the Headmaster can help and more teachers attentive during the breaks could be a solution.
