
# Learning Teaching Training Activities Bistriţa, Romania 19 – 23 May 2025

This feedback report provides a summary and analysis of participant responses following the recent Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity conducted as part of the Erasmus+ IT'S TIME project (2023-1-R001-KA220-SCH-00015920) organized in Bistriţa, Romania, between 19 – 23 May 2025.

The aim of the LTTA was to deepen understanding of sustainable fashion practices, promote ecoconscious design thinking, and encourage responsible consumer behaviour. Through workshops, activities, and expert-led sessions, participants engaged with key concepts in slow fashion and sustainable living.

The feedback questionnaire was completed by 67 people, of whom 74.6% were students and 25.4% teachers. Among the students, 58,2% have previously participated in Erasmus mobilities.











Have you ever participated in an Erasmus+ mobility program? 67 de răspunsuri



The main reasons for participating in the mobility were to learn about other cultures, experience a new environment, to meet and network with other students and teachers, but also to learn about slow fashion and responsible consumption and production.

What was your motivation to participate in the mobility? 67 de răspunsuri









We can conclude that the mobility met the participants' expectations and provided a positive experience, as 65.7% reported being very satisfied with the activities and 32.8% were satisfied. Given that teenagers generally enjoy being active and exploring new places, the most popular activities were hiking along the *Via Transilvanica* and visiting the *Turda Salt Mine*. Additionally, participants enjoyed the icebreaking activities, the creative workshop on using discarded fabric to create artwork and transforming old jeans into accessories.

The least favorite activity was the visit to the University of Agricultural Sciences and Veterinary Medicine of Cluj-Napoca, as the presentations and the workshop were a bit too long, leaving no time to explore the city.

## What was your least favourite activity and why?

# **Section 2: Learning outcomes**


The following skills were achieved/mostly/fully achieved:

- Improved communication in English (94%)
- Improved collaboration and teamwork skills (92.53%)
- Enhanced intercultural understanding and awareness (92.53%)
- Can reflect on personal fashion habits and how to make sustainable choices (92.53%)
- Improved understanding of slow fashion goals (89.55%)
- Can appreciate more the value of craftmanship, reuse and mindful production (89.55%)
- Can define slow fashion and can explain how it differs from fast fashion (83.82%)
- Can apply basic techniques for repairing, upcycling, and customizing clothes (86.56%)







To what extent do you feel you have achieved the following learning outcomes during the mobility?



90.5% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that the mobility contributed to their personal development. They reported improvements in building connections with people from different backgrounds (benefiting their future academic and professional opportunities) as well as increased confidence in their abilities, a greater appreciation for cultural diversity, the ability to challenge stereotypes, and enhanced cooperation with people from other cultures.






# Section3: Cultural exchange and networking

Regarding cultural exchange and networking, 47.8% of the participants felt they had enough opportunities to interact with students and teachers, while 43.3% felt they had some opportunities but that there could have been more. Only 4.5% believed there were not enough opportunities. Social activities were also highly appreciated, with 71.6% of participants rating them as very valuable. Only two participants felt that the social activities were not valuable.

Did you have sufficient opportunities to interact with students/teachers from other countries? 67 de răspunsuri











How valuable were the social activities (in and outside school) in enhancing your experience? 67 de răspunsuri



More than half of the foreign students and teachers (23 participants) felt that they learned a great deal about the culture of the host country, while 17 participants reported learning somewhat about it. Additionally, 82.1% of participants plan to keep in touch with the people they met during the mobility.

For foreign students/teachers only - How much did you learn about the culture of the host country during the LTTA?



Do you plan to keep in touch with the people you met during the mobility? 67 de răspunsuri




# **Section 4: Logistic and support**

More than 70% of the teachers were satisfied with the travel arrangements, the arrival process, and the school facilities used for workshops and activities. They also appreciated the quality and comfort of the accommodation. Furthermore, 82.5% of the foreign participants felt very well supported during their stay in Bistriţa. Among the students who stayed with host families, 63.6% rated their experience as excellent, 12.1% as great, and 9.1% as good.

Foreign teachers only - How satisfied were you with the travel arrangements provided (e.g., transportation, transfers)?









Foreign teachers only - Was the arrival process (welcome, orientation) clear and well-organized? 20 de răspunsuri

Foreign students/teachers only -How satisfied were you with the meal arrangements? 43 de răspunsuri











Foreign students/teachers only- Did you feel supported by the host organization and staff during your stay?








Among the students who stayed with host families, 63.6% rated their experience as excellent, 12.1% as great, and 9.1% as good.

I was in a great family, they were able to meet my every need and were always very polite and thoughtful towards me, I was able to socialize with all of them


I am very happy with my host family and how they treated me. I felt at home, I loved spending time with them. I wish I had more time.






Among the host students, 76% rated their experience as hosts as excellent, 20% as great, and 4% (1 student) as acceptable. Additionally, 96.3% of them would participate in another international mobility.

### **Conclusions**

Based on the feedback provided, several clear conclusions can be drawn regarding the success and impact of the mobility project:

### **Overall Satisfaction and Emotional Impact**

Participants overwhelmingly described the experience as *positive, memorable, and emotionally rewarding*. Many expressed deep appreciation, calling it the "best experience" they've had, indicating a strong emotional connection and personal growth.

Words like "amazing," "cherish," "laugh," and "thank you" suggest that the project created a warm, inclusive, and joyful atmosphere.





# **Quality and Organization of Activities**

Activities were widely described as *original*, *fun*, *engaging*, and *well-organized*, with many praising the *effort and passion* put into the program by the Romanian team. The variety of activities, especially outdoor experiences like *hiking* and *visiting the salt mine*—were particularly appreciated. The slow fashion theme was generally well-received and considered educational.

#### **Cultural Exchange and Networking**

Many participants highlighted the opportunity to *make friends* and *connect with people from different countries*. This confirms that the mobility successfully facilitated cultural exchange and interpersonal relationships.

#### **Educational Value**

The workshops, particularly those related to *slow fashion* and *artistic creation*, were mentioned positively. One suggestion noted that *more work could have been done on fast fashion*, indicating a desire for even deeper engagement on the main theme.

### **Facilities and Hosting**

The school environment was described as *beautiful and comfortable*, and the hosts received direct praise, reflecting well on the organization and hospitality. Participants left the mobility feeling emotionally enriched, with broader perspectives on sustainability, fashion, and intercultural understanding.

# Areas for improvement

Several students, especially host students, expressed disappointment at not being involved in enough shared activities or having sufficient opportunities to connect with foreign participants. This was largely due to the high number of Romanian students involved in the project and the limited capacity to accommodate more than 40 participants in the activities.

A significant number of participants mentioned that the schedule was too packed, with little to no free time, especially in Cluj-Napoca, and that they would have liked time off only for visiting. Some participants felt that the workshops could have been more hands-on, with a deeper focus on fast fashion or more structured DIY elements.

This Erasmus+ mobility was a successful experience for the vast majority of participants. It fostered strong intercultural bonds, deep emotional connections, and valuable educational insights. While the organization and passion behind the project were widely appreciated, future editions could benefit from:

- Greater integration of host and guest students in shared activities;
- More free time or informal moments for exploration and relaxation;
- Further improvement in workshop content to deepen engagement with the project's themes.
